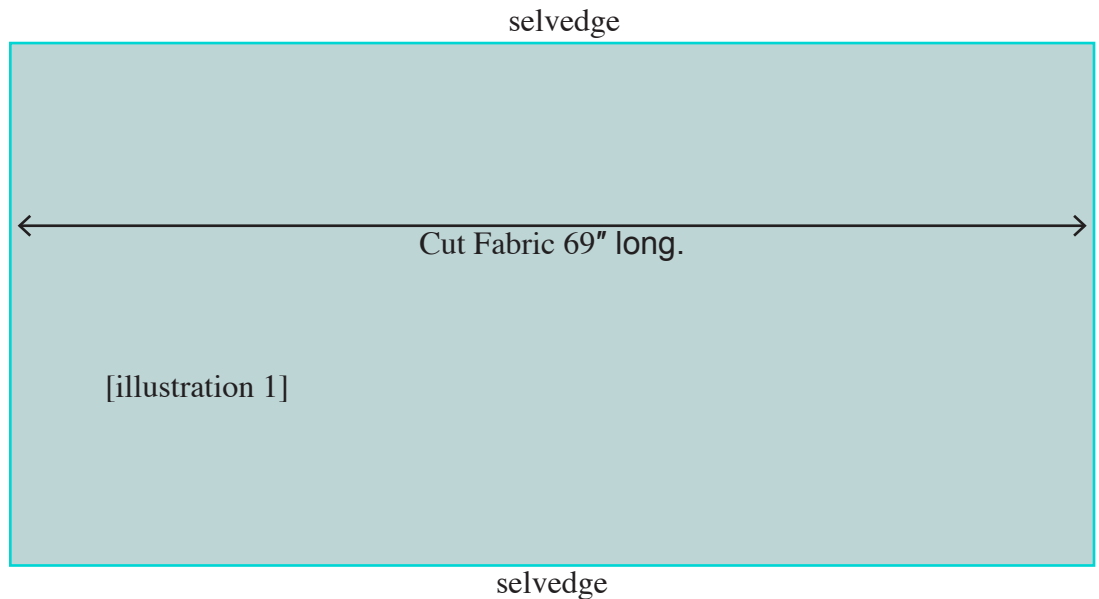
# Crib Sheet

## **What you'll need:**

- 2 yards of cotton (pre-washed and non stretch), 44" – 45" wide
- 48" of 3/8" elastic cut into 4 - 12" lengths
- Serger or Sewing Machine

1. Cut fabric 69" long

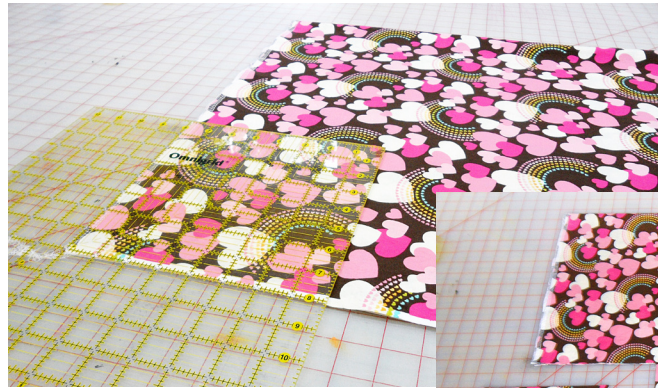


2. Serge raw edges of short ends.

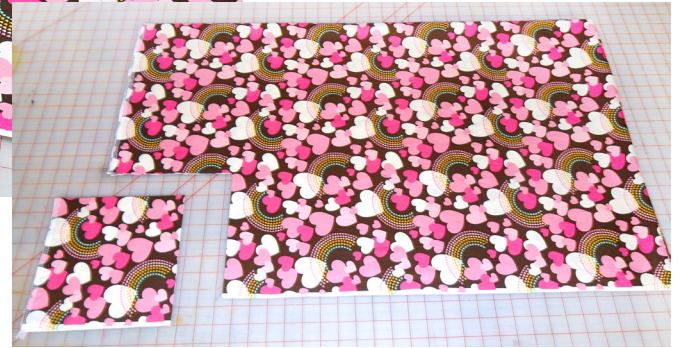
3. Fold fabric in half serged end to serged end and again salvage end to salvage end so that it is quartered.

4. Cut an 8" x 8" square through all layers, out of the corner that has no folds.

5. Fold one corner with right sides together and serge. Repeat for remaining 3 corners.

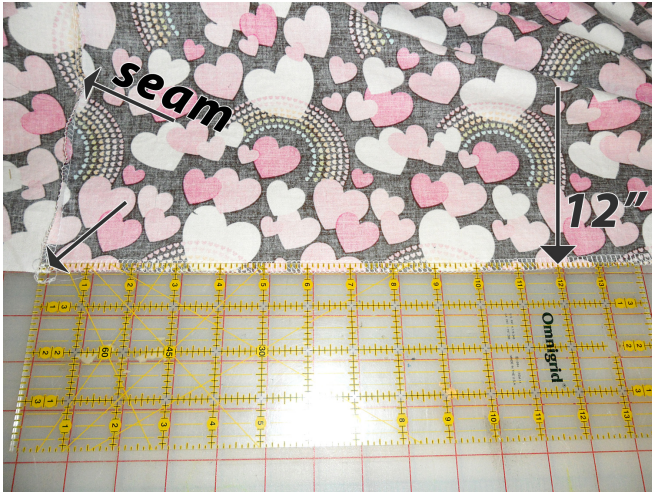

6. Measure 12" from each side of one seam and mark. Repeat for remaining 3 corners.

7. Find center of 12" elastic strip and pin to seam. Repeat for remaining 3 corners.

8. Place end of elastic at 12" mark and anchor by stitching with serger. Stretch elastic so it is an even length with the fabric and serge to the pin. Remove pin and stretch elastic to meet the next mark. Serge. Repeat for remaining 3 corners.
