
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

Technique: Easy Embroidery Details (running stitch and split stitch)

STRAIGHT STITCH / RUNNING STITCH

Working from right to left, make a straight stitch by bringing the needle up and insert 1/8 to 1/4" (3 to 6 mm) from the starting point. To make a line of running stitches (a row of straight stitches worked one after the other), bring the needle up and repeat.

SPLIT STITCH

Working from left to right, bring the needle up and then insert it down (see picture), then bring the needle up near the right end of the previous stitch, inserting the needle into the thread to split the thread in two. When you're working with multiple strands of thread, insert the needle between the strands.
