Infinity Scarf

Materials

Two 18" x 20" pieces tulle or stretch mesh


1/2 yd. knit fabric

Water soluble stabilizer, cloth-type


It's hard to believe a lace pocket design can transform into a sweet embellishment for an infinity scarf but it's true and very easy to do. Just spend a few minutes in embroidery editing software to make the transition.

Step 1. At the Computer


Retrieve design ScallopLaceJumbo in Perfect Placement software or other embroidery editing software.




Select the design and right click on it to Ungroup.




Select the outside scallop line and alignment marks and delete them.




Regroup the remaining elements. Copy, paste and vertically flip the design. Move the second design below the first to fill your largest hoop.



Fill in the open center area with several flowers. Select a small flower as shown below.



Copy and paste the flower as shown.



Save the design in the appropriate format and send it to the machine.

Step 2. Stitch the Lace

Hoop water soluble stabilizer and two layers of tulle or one piece of stretch mesh. Stitch the design.



Remove from the hoop and rinse away the stabilizer. Lay the lace on a terrycloth towel. Roll and squeeze the towel to absorb the moisture. Unroll and let dry. Press with low heat.

Trim the lace at the short ends. Piece the lace to the remaining tulle or stretch panel on the long edge. Use a very narrow zigzag to sew a secure stitch on these loose weave fabrics.

Step 3. Make the Scarf

Piece one short end of the lace to one short end of the knit fabric, right sides together. Press the seam towards the knit fabric. Fold the pieced fabric in half, right sides together, and sew the long seam. Pin the remaining short ends right sides together to make a tube, aligning the seam. Stitch the seam as far as you can. Turn right side out and topstitch the opening closed.

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
