## **TUTORIAL:**

## MONOGRAM:

- 1. Cut a piece of fabric slightly larger than the front pattern piece.
- 2. With a heat soluble marker trace the front bodice pattern and THREAD TRACE the center line. This step helps with the monogram placement and identifies the grainline of the fabric.
- 3. Embroider monogram with a POLYESTER EMBROIDERY THREAD. This type of thread is durable and fade resistant especially important for a garment that will be out in the sun and near the water.
- 4. Follow pattern manufacture's instructions for garment assembly.
- 5. Attach the pompom trim around the neck between the neckline and neckline facing.

## CREATING A SLEEVE OR HEM FACING FOR POM-POM TRIM INSERTION

- 1. Cut a 2 ½" strip of the fashion fabric.
- 2. Measure your sleeve or hem and cut an extra inch for a ½" seam allowance.
- 3. Stitch the piece together at the end
- 4. Turn one edge under ½"
- 5. With a heat soluble marker, mark the seam allowance and pin the pompom tape along the upper edge with the pompoms facing AWAY from the seam allowance.
- 6. Baste the pompoms with a machine or by hand
- 7. Slip the facing over the garment and secure with pins followed by hand basting.

## ATTACHING THE FACING

Using a zipper foot allows you to stich right next to the pompoms.

You want the POM-POM tape to be below the stitching line so it doesn't show when turned. This will create a larger seam allow that you'll need to trim.

- 1. Remove your pins and your basting.
- 2. Check to make sure the tape is not visible.
- 3. Turn
- 4. Press and stitch the facing to the tunic.

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
